Welcome and Introduction	Laurie Ellston welcomed attendees and facilitated introductions.	
Approval of Minutes	Dotti Groover-Skipper asked that all members review minutes from the April meeting and raise any for discussion if needed, then asked for a vote to approve minutes.	No discussion, Rhiannon Capling made motion to approve minutes, Dr. David Drobos seconded. Motion carried.
Partner Updates	Laurie invited all partners to provide any community updates. Rhiannon Capling reported as an FYI that "Books A Million" by the Brandon mall are selling pens in the shape of a cigarette. Suspects the pens are provided by the tobacco industry. Rhiannon also reported that the non-profit company, "Cancer Rock Star" would benefit from any resources TFPH could provide. Dotti reported TFPH is providing resources for TGH, and will host a table for TGH at the "Dance Your Ash Off" event June 30, 2010. Aimee Johnson reported the AHEC will have 3 groups for cessation at TGH. Jeff Ransdell provided a pamphlet on Hess and tobacco, reported that Manatee County schools hire only non-smokers, and he reported on the tobacco free efforts of TGH. The TGH campus is going tobacco free January 1, 2011. Jeff also would like for TFPH to develop a strategy toolkit for Tobacco-Free schools/workplaces. John Helman encouraged the members to check out the website: "Rethink Your Quit." Dr. Drobos reported that Moffitt continues their clinical trials and has materials for distribution. Amber Smith reported on the "Ought To Be A Law" student initiative results.	TFPH is providing resources to TGH for their "Dance Your Ash Off" event June 30 and hosting a table. Youth	Laurie reported on SWAT and the success of the "Sandblast" event and the "Stomp It Out" contest. Laurie reported that Victor DeNoble will present in Hillsborough County at 3 school locations on May 20.	"Sandblast" had 33 students from Hillsborough attend and over 400 students attended the event. The "Stomp It Put" contest had over 1400 people vote on the videos and posters. Durant High School won the video and Memorial Middle School won the poster. The winning students will appear on Channel 10, May 21.
Policy	Laurie presented on the 2010-2011 SMART Objectives of the DOH Tobacco grant	HCADA anticipates renewal of the Tobacco DOH grant in July.
Old Business/New Business	Partners were reminded of the Smoke Free Campus call on May 12 at 1pm / Dotti is presenting info on TFPH to the Hillsborough County Medical Association May 18. Dotti reported that the "Clean Air Fair" was a huge success and many downtown businesses are now aware of TFPH.	Dotti is working with DUI CounterAttack to place "Breathe Easy Zones" at both Hillsborough locations within the next few months. Many corporate connections were made at the "Clean Air Fair" for workplace tobacco policy initiatives.
